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NUGGETS OF WISDOM FROM THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE

- There will always be people around you who cannot handle your greatness, but the one person who must be able to handle your greatness is yourself.
- Know your strengths, your weaknesses, your self-sabotaging patterns of behaviour. Starve your weaknesses by not putting yourself in situations that spark the weaknesses.
- There are certain things in your life that will help you discover your purpose. These are usually found when you answer questions such as: What burdens you? What grieves you?
- Know the place you were created to operate in—we are not called to be everywhere. Whenever you're in the right place, doing the right thing, you'll thrive.
- Know your niche target group who were you equipped to unleash talent from? Which people are equipped to help you?
- Have principles that guard and manage your greatness.
- Always ask yourself if you fit into the organisation you are trying to be part of, whether it makes use of your skills, noting that different/foreign cultures may be trickier to deal with.
- Understand all the terminology, and generally as much as you can about the company during the induction week.
- Socialise with your colleagues on the board; don't group as "the ladies" mix with gentlemen, too. Also socialise outside the board, places like Rotary Clubs; let people know you.
- Training in finance is a big plus.
- There is no small board; every board is making an impact in the country and the world.
- Treat everyone with humility and respect—this does not mean you have to like them, but you should treat them well nonetheless.
- Lend a hand—leadership is about service.
- When it comes to dressing, one needs to know their brand and the kind of message they are
 trying to convey and dress accordingly. It is also important to keep in mind the people one is
 meeting in order not to offend.
